Moments of Faith

Family life can be busy and complicated.

We can also want to nurture our families faith.

It was these two thoughts that inspired the Moments of Faith for Everyday project. There are printed cards available and also an Instagram profile @momentsoffaithforeveryday. The idea being that each day of the week has a different theme and that over time it will become a habit to think of the days with the theme in mind eg. Mindful Monday, Talking Tuesday, Wonder Wednesday. For those who are feeling creative you can then take the theme of the day and then do something for just a few minutes with your family on the that day. For those whose minds are full of all the things that that life involves, there are ideas on the different slides for simple things you can do each day together as a household. The Instagram profile will also grow over time and you can always scroll through and find a simple idea for each day.

Collective Worship – Many of our churches go into schools to lead Collective Worship/Assemblies. It is rather strange this term when we can't go into the schools as we normally do but there are ways round this.

I (Rachel Scheffer) am also loving doing more Collective Worship sessions than ever before. I am recording them on zoom and then emailing them to the school.

Benefit of this method is that some schools can't access YouTube and also the emailed file can then be played in each individual classroom when the time is right and convenient to the teacher (it also reminds the schools that we are glad that we have a relationship with them and that we want to support them at this time). The files are usually huge but can be transferred easily and for free via https://www.transfernow.net/en/

I am also finding that it can feel even more like a worship service than ever by having some regular things like lighting a candle and inviting the children to settle into a special time while the candle is being lit. I also do some things where I show props or just chat to the camera, however there is also scope to change your virtual background or screen share. I am particularly enjoying screen sharing and have found some wonderful videos, songs and stories online (please make sure you have the right licenses in place to do this).
