#### **Prayers**

Simeon and Anna could see that Jesus was very special. They knew that he had been sent by God to rescue people from pain and sadness and hardship, just like light shining in the darkness. Light in darkness helps to make us feel safe and helps us to see the way to go. Simeon and Anna know that Jesus is going to shine like a light to show people the way God wants them to go and that he will give people hope when things seem dark and scary.

<u>You will need:</u> Light cover print out, felt tips or coloured pencils, scissors, blue tack, laminator and laminating pouches (optional)

Colour in a light switch cover, cut it out and stick it over the space where there is a light switch on a wall in your house. Every time you switch the light on, remind yourself that Jesus is always with you when things seem dark and sad and scary.

Jesus, thank you that, even when the world around us seems dark and worrying and scary, you are always with us, shining like a light in the darkness. When we are sad or scared or worried, give us hope, help us to feel safe and show us the way to go as we live our lives. Amen

May we know that we are cared for.








- 1. Colour in the light switch covers.

# **Prayer Light Tubes**

You will need: battery operated tea lights, A6 size paper, felt tip pens, glue

Put the A6 Paper in landscape orientation and ask children to draw pictures and write the names of people and places who are going through dark, hard times and need to see some light and hope.



Wrap the paper around the tea light and glue down the edge to make a tube.



Ask Jesus to bring his light and hope to these people and situations. Switch off the lights and switch the tea lights on. Look at the light shining through the situations as a sign that they have been handed to Jesus.
