As we pray, pull a slip out of the jar and say thank you for what is written on it. Continue to fill the jar during the week.

Do you wonder anything about this story?

Prayers

In our story we saw that, even after the worst thing that could possibly happen, the death of Jesus, new life and hope and joy was possible. After a short time of waiting Jesus rose to new life and this means that, whatever has happened in our lives, however we have messed up, whatever bad has happened, with Jesus there is always hope and the chance to start again.

This is a fun but slightly messy way to celebrate the new life of the resurrection. Just like in the Easter story, there will be a little waiting time before you see the new life!

You will need: See Seed Bomb activity below.

When the seed bombs are dry, think about areas of your life where you would like to see new things happening and new life starting. Plant the seed bombs or just place them in the garden where you would like the seeds to grow and watch nature take its course.

Dear God thank you for resurrection and the hope of new life. Thank you that, whatever we have done and whatever has happened, with you there is always the chance to state again. Show us where we need to make new starts in our life and help us to grow in new ways. Help us to share hope and joy with others. Amen

New life Easter seed bombs

<u>You will need:</u> a large mixing bowl full of shredded paper, water, a food processor or hand held processor, 2-3 tablespoons of wildflower seeds, kitchen roll or paper towels, a sieve, a tray

Soak the shredded paper in the water for 10-15 mins and then squeeze out as much of the water as you can. A sieve might help with this part. Put the wet paper into a food processor and process it into a pulp. You might need to do this in batches. Put the pulp into the mixing bowl and mix the seeds into it. With your hands, make ping pong ball sized balls of the paper and seed mixture. Put some paper towels on a baking tray and but the balls on top. Leave them to dry for 24 hours.
